Paisley Association Loses Stalwart Members

The year 2012 saw the passing of three dedicated members of the Paisley Family Association. Lib Paisley Kennedy passed away on May 6th. Eula Kiger Paisley passed on August 2nd. Hazel Smith Lester passed on September 19th. Eula and Hazel participated in the original gathering of the Paisley "clan" in 1969. Although neither had been able to attend recent meetings, both had continued their membership. Records from 1973 show that Lib had added her support to the organization in that year. She was a strong presence in the life of the organization for the past 25+ years.

MARY ELIZABETH PAISLEY "LIB" KENNEDY

Mary Elizabeth "Lib" Paisley Kennedy, 89, passed away on May 6, 2012 in Greensboro, North Carolina. Funeral services and burial were at Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church located at 5120 Burlington Road in Greensboro, NC

Lib was born February 17, 1923 to Carlton Vance (Ted) and Minnie Shaw Paisley. For all but the two years during WWII when she was with her husband in Virginia, she was a lifelong resident of the McLeansville community in Guilford County North Carolina.

As an active member of Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church for 79 years, Lib served her church loyally. She was a teacher in the Children's Division. She served as a member of the Administrative Board, the Church Building and Long Range Planning Committees, and many other committees and commissions. She was a charter member of the Pleasanteers Circle. She spent many hours helping needlepoint the kneeling cushions for the altar of the church. She loved nature, gardening, canning and was a wonderful cook.

Lib had the distinction of attending all her schooling with a record of perfect attendance and graduated from McLeansville High School in 1940. She was very active in her local community affairs. She was a charter member of the McLeansville Lioness Club and active in the Home Demonstration Club, and supported the 4-H and scouting organizations as well as many others.

Upon graduation from high school, Lib began her working career at Blue Bell Manufacturing Company, continued on at Starr Electric Company, Vick Chemical Company, and P. Lorillard Tobacco Company from which she retired after 21 years of service.

In addition to her parents, Lib was preceded in death by brothers Aubrey and Wade Paisley, and sisters Inez Bennet, Sally Idol, Fanny Young, and Nettie McCollum.

She is survived by Curtis, her loving husband of 69 years, her son C. Roland Kennedy, Jr., and her daughter Fran Kennedy Sherrill and husband Jerry. She is also survived by her grandchildren, Deana Sherrill King and husband Randall, Curt Sherrill and wife Robin, and Jennifer Kennedy Mengas and husband Rick, and great-grandchildren, Andrew and Ethan King, Lance Dodson, and Addison Sherrill.

Lib and Curtis were faithful members of the Paisley Family Association. They could be counted on to attend and actively support the Association as well as the Paisley Family Society. Lib attended her final Paisley reunion last

"Besides being blessed with the "storybook" Mother-Daughter relationship that some long for, wish or dream of - we shared giggles and laughter - a lot! It did not take much to get us tickled and to make eye contact, especially in places like church, for then it was on. We laughed at ourselves mostly as well as life's little twists and turns.

"One instance in Meyer's department store stands out in my mind as if it happened yesterday. I was in high school. We approached and stepped on to the escalator while deeply involved in conversation having a wonderful time, completely oblivious to our surroundings. We realized we had not moved towards the top only to discover the escalator was not operating. Had no idea how many others were wondering what we were thinking or doing, much less laughing at us standing there in our own little world going nowhere. But, none more than the two of us laughing at ourselves. We simply went and sat down in nearby chairs until we were "all laughed out".

"Shopping was not always about buying. It was the outing experience itself - of being together that brought us so much enjoyment! A real treat for me (meaning it did not happen every trip to town) was sharing a piece of apple pie or a BLT at Woolworth's food counter. Later in life as Mother, Deana and I shopped on the day after Thanksgiving, many of those same earlier feelings swept over me. We always made sure we took care of our tummies plus enjoyed a special cup of afternoon coffee usually while at the book store. Never were we short on laughter during our day.

"Oh, how I miss her and cherish all the years she and I had and yes, the giggles too! I loved her dearly."

HAZEL SMITH LESTER



Paisley/Pasley Records from Grayson County, Virginia

This newsletter has not published many records from Grayson County, Virginia. In issue 8 (2000) two Grayson Co. deeds of Isaac Pacely were printed, but Isaac soon moved on to Illinois. Isaac's brother Samuel and many of his descendants stayed in the area. Below are records from a cemetery in the Mouth of Wilson area of Grayson. The oldest Paisley graves are for Drury Calvin Paisley and his wife Polly Jane Halsey Paisley. Drury (or Drewry) was the son of John Calvin and Caroline Senter Pasley and the grandson of Samuel and Nancy Peak Pasley. Samuel was the son of John Peasley, the orphan son of John Paisley, the immigrant from Tyrone County, Ireland.

Paisley Family DNA Project

The Paisley Family DNA project now has 14 participants. Participants are currently broken down into 4 categories:

- ◇ Chieftain /Ninian Paisley group
- ◇ Sabine Pasley group
- ◇ Scots-Irish group (Scotland and Tyrone County, Ireland)
- ◇ William Woodrow "Joseph" Peasley group

Participant #245623 Tom Pasley of Vermont has started a new line of Paisley DNA. His Y-DNA sequence does not match any other Paisley participants and his Haplgroup is I2a3 instead of R1b1a2. Tom's information of his family comes from an old family bible that his father owns:

Great-Grandfather:

Clinton St Clair Sabine Pasley- born Lewes, Sussex, England Jan 31st 1874- Passed away Dec 9 1941

Wife Katherine Violet Phillips- born Dec 17th 1872- passed away Aug 7 1940- died in Toronto

Married Hampstead, London, England March 15th 1895

Grandfather--Clinton Sabine Pasley- Bradford Yorkshire England- Oct. 17th 1896 died in Ottawa June 25th- 1947 Married Margaret Lawlor Sept 22nd 1926 at St. Patrick's Church Ottawa

Father - Francis Clinton Sabine Pasley - born Ottawa, Ontario.

It is possible that Clinton St. Clair Sabine-Pasley is descended from Sir Thomas Sabine Pasley, 2nd Baronet (1804-1884) who inherited his maternal grandfather Sir Thomas Pasley's baronet title. There was no male heir so an act of parliament permitted the title to fall to Thomas Sabine, son of Major John Sabine and Maria Pasley. Thomas then added Pasley to his surname. This would explain why the DNA is so different from other Paisley participants.

Participant # 237895 is Joe Paisley of Wyoming. He upgraded his DNA to 67 markers. Joe is a descendant of Robert Paisley B: 1758, Colerain, Lancaster, PA. Comparing Joe with the only other participant to have 67 markers tested, **# 201483** Tom Paisley of Richmond, we see one mutation at marker # 57. Further upgrading from other participants will reveal which marker number is the standard.

Participant # 248601 is Bill Paceley (William H. Paceley) born in Birmingham, AL. son of Lewis Robison Paceley (b.1903,Birmingham, AL). His grandfather was Lewis Franklin Paceley (b.1861, Rockport, Indiana) and great-grandfather was Benjamin Franklin Paceley (born approx.1820). Lewis Franklin Paceley came to Birmingham in approx. 1890 to work for Tennessee Coal and Iron. He is buried in Leeds, Alabama, next to his wife Leona and his father-in-law William Enoch Robison who was a veteran of the Confederate cavalry. The story Bill's aunts told him was that it took many courting calls and letter of reference from boyhood friends from Rockport before his great-grandpa Robison would allow Lewis Franklin and Leona to marry. Even though grandpa Paceley was only a baby at the time of the Civil War, when he came down South (1890) his Indiana accent made him a suspicious character. Bill's DNA matches exactly to some of the participants descended from Tyrone Co, Ireland immigrants William and John Paisley. Bill's great-grandfather Benjamin Franklin was possibly the son of Hugh Paceley, Jr. (b.abt.1770 in PA or VA, moved to Madison Co, KY, then to Hamilton Co., OH) Hugh was listed in the 1850 census of Hamilton Co. OH next to Benj. F. Pacely. A Hugh Pasley Sr. and Hugh Pasley Jr. were listed in the 1810 census of Madison Co. KY. If anyone has done extensive research into these branches, please contact the newsletter editor.

Our newest **participant # 264605** is John Porter Paisley of Florida and McLeansville, NC. John is descended from William and Elenor McLean Paisley, through their son, Col. John Paisley. With John's participation we are finally able to confirm the DNA sequence of William and John Paisley of Tyrone County, Ireland.

Our first two participants, Bud and Ernest, are descended from William Paisley Jr. Their DNA differed from each other in two locations – markers 21 and 23. Subsequent participants descended from John Paisley of Kent County, Delaware (William Jr's uncle) and the DNA tests showed one difference from Bud on Marker #23 and one difference from Ernest on Marker #21. Did the two brothers, William, Sr. and John, who immigrated from Tyrone County, Ireland have different DNA or did the mutations occur later? With the latest test done by John Porter Paisley, we can confirm that the DNA sequence of the two immigrant brothers was exactly the same. The mutations in the William Jr. line occurred in later generations.
